Thornbury Township Board of Supervisors Public Meeting, Wednesday, June 2, 2021

The Thornbury Township Board of Supervisors held a Public Meeting, Wednesday June 2, 2021, hosted at Thornbury Park, 345 Glen Mills Road, Cheyney PA. Chairman Raith called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with a salute to the flag.

PARKS & RECREATION

Mike Mattson reported that Yoga in the Park begins on June 7, on the tennis courts, Mondays at 7pm. Pop-up music in the gazebo begins this month. Mike said they are making plans for July 4th. Trees for Ten is scheduled for the Fall and they are considering making it an annual event with the THS sharing the expense. Minor discussions included trees and identifying the emerald ash borer. Lastly, Rich mentioned their creek water quality collections. The Board thanked Rich.

LIBRARY BOARD

Jean Mackenzie reported they are back open Monday through Saturday. The Grab and Go option of book pick up may stay. A June 17th film screening on Women's Rights will be featured and the bronze bell a local group toured with was found at Valley Forge Park. It is presently on display, and a visit there would make for a great family outing. Lastly Jean mentioned they will also have a virtual tour of Eastern Penitentiary. The Board thanked Jean.

Jr. SUPERVISOR

Lily Seagraves reported on Rustin Rumbings:

Daisies for Bianca spread the love food drive is currently underway food donations are being collected and given to the Chester County food bank. AGENDA ITEMS

Chuck Faulkner reported on the Aeration Tank painting contract.

On a motion by Sheri Perkins, seconded by James Kelly, and carried unanimously, awarding the Aeration Tank Painting Contract base bid to J.P. Smith Contractors, Inc. in the amount of \$171,570.00, contingent upon their execution of the contract and supply of the required bonds and insurance, in accordance with the Township Sewer Engineer's recommendation letter dated May 27, 2021. was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment. There was no comment. Chairman Raith commented this needed to be done.

Jeff Seagraves detailed the new Disability Insurance proposal.

On a motion by James Kelly, seconded by Sheri Perkins, and carried unanimously, the Disability Insurance Policy from the Mutual of Omaha Insurance Company as detailed in their proposal dated March 31, 2021, was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment. There was no comment.

Jeff Seagraves reported on the need for Summer Camp help.

On a motion by Sheri Perkins, seconded by James Kelly, and carried unanimously, hiring the following staff at the corresponding rates: Cindy McCord, of CMC Productions as Camp Director at a cost of \$175.00 per session, Jeremiah Daudert at a salary of \$15.00 per hour, Lauren Turco at \$15.00 per hour, Annie Seagraves at \$150.00 per session, and one additional part-time person at \$12.00 per hour. Chairman Raith called for comment, then commented he got a lot of calls about summer camp.

TOWNSHIP MANAGER'S REPORT- Jeff Seagraves

Jeff reported we opened our office to the public on Tuesday June 2, 2021. All staff are back in the office, and we are requiring masks to be worn by visitors.

We held the annual Memorial Day Service, in person, on Monday May 31, 2021. The goats arrived on Tuesday evening. They should be on site at Barrett's Meadow until the end of the week. The movie in the park went well on Friday May 21st. Jeff attended District Court on Tuesday May 25, 2021. The presiding Judge issued a \$5,000.00 fine to the owner of 27 Sweetwater Rd. The defendant's attorney indicated that he will be appealing the decision.

The Thornbury Township golf night at The Golf Course at Glen Mills starts tonight. There were 14 signed up for tonight.

We received information today regarding the township's ability to apply for the American Rescue Plan from PSATS and our solicitor. Applications will be submitted to DCED, and they have recommended that application should be completed within the next 5 days. Jeff requested that the board authorize him to execute any documents that will be required.

On a motion by James Kelly, seconded by Sheri Perkins, and carried unanimously, authorizing the Township Manager to execute any documents that will be required for the application of American Rescue Plan funding, was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment. Rich White asked what that was. Chairman Raith explained that is Federal stimulus funding for the Covid recovery plan.

Jeff reported there will be a pop-up drive thru vaccination here at Thornbury Park, Tuesday June 8th from 1:30 pm to 4:00 pm. There will be both Moderna and J&J vaccinations available. Chairman Raith asked Jeff to please advertise that.

Lastly, Jeff thanked Lily for her service to the community and then thanked the Board and our community for their support of Lily for the past 18 years, it has been impressive and Jeff thanked them all from the bottom of his heart. The Board thanked Jeff.

1. We opened our office to the public on Tuesday June 2, 2021. All staff are back in the office, and we are requiring masks to be worn by visitors.
2. We held the annual Memorial Day Service, in person, on Monday 5-31-21.
3. We are working on the summer camp plans and would like to recommend the hiring the following staff at the corresponding rates: Cindy McCord, of CMC Productions as Camp Director at a cost of \$175.00 per session, Jeremiah Daudert at a salary of \$15.00 per hour, Lauren Turco at \$15.00 per hour and Annie Seagraves at \$150.00 per session. We are still looking for a part time person to hire at \$12 per hour, but hours will be limited and depend on enrollment.

1. Black Bell Farm – Working with developer's counsel to finalize maintenance and dedication documentation.
2. Right-to-Know – Updated Township Manager that the Pennsylvania Senate currently has two Right-to-Know Law bills before it: a) SB 312, which would allow townships to charge a reasonable fee for commercial requests, and b) SB 552, which would allow townships to petition the Office of Open Records for relief from "vexatious requesters" — those who use the Right-to-Know Law to intimidate, harass, or punish an agency, leading to wasted taxpayer resources. REPORT OF THE ENGINEER
June Supervisor's Meeting
June 2, 2021

Work completed for the period:

Grading and Road Encroachment Permits – Reviewed several plans for grading and road encroachment. Construction inspections continue.

Planning Commission – Continued working with members on Ordinances and Subdivisions.

Subdivision & Land Development Plans:

Lawler Subdivision - Awaiting revised plans.

Daniels Subdivision – 425 Thornton Rd – 2 Lots – Conditional Final approval granted in 2016. Awaiting updated recording plans and agreements for signature.

15 Tanguy Road – 2,400 SF Accessory Structure Land Development – Land Development Plans reviewed and discussed with the Planning Commission in December. Awaiting revised plans and re-review with Planning Commission.

VMDT – Dilworthtown Road – Reviewed Zoning paperwork with Township Officials. Awaiting Subdivision / Land Development submission for complete review.

1661 Old Gradyville Road – Minor Lot Line Change – Property is mostly within Edgmont Township, with no development or changes within Thornbury. Board recommended conditional approval on 4/21/21. Awaiting revised plans for signature and recording.

Ordinances:

Sign Ordinance – PC forwarded ordinance to the Supervisors for consideration.

Plant Materials List – Reviewed current Township Ordinance Plant Materials List and issued our Landscape Architect's recommendations for exclusions due to local blights and diseases. Reviewed with the Planning Commission in May. PC forwarded list changes to the Supervisors for consideration.

Crane Property – 24 Lot Subdivision – Roadway curb, stone, base course paving and binder paving has been installed for all roadways. Work continues on stormwater facilities, utilities, retaining walls, site, and multiple home lots. Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 23 homes are now occupied. House construction continues on Lots 13, 22, & 24. Review of conversion of existing temporary CO's to Permanent CO's are ongoing.

Black Bell Farm (Walton Lane) – 15 lot subdivision – Lots 1-14 (All new homes) are now occupied. Per developer's request, an updated Punch List was issued on 5-7-2021 (originally issued 7-23-2020). Awaiting corrections and paperwork for dedication.

Guilday Site – Lots 1-5 houses are occupied with Temporary CO's. Final Inspections ongoing for Final CO's and moving towards project closeout. Surveyor has set property corners. Awaiting closeout paperwork.

Sunoco Logistics – Sunoco has completed all piping work. Valve station work has been completed. Final Restoration is scheduled for Spring.

NPDES MS-4 Program – 2018 Pollutant Reduction Plan and 2018 MS-4 permit submitted on September 9, 2017 & September 15, 2017, respectively. Continuing to work with PA DEP on revisions. Detailed updates to the storm sewer and qualifying watershed mapping has been completed to comply with revision requests from PA DEP. Program is currently under Township review prior to re-submission of mapping.

Thornbury Park Parking Lot Expansion – Trainor Concrete & Paving completed final paving and striping on October 9, 2018. Minor corrections at the site are required to allow for final paperwork submission for closeout. Drainage improvements completed the week of January 7, 2019.

Cheyney University Demolition – Yarnell Building has been demolished. Site has been stabilized. Erosion controls removed. Projects appears to be completed, awaiting final inspection request.

Thornbury Park Rain Garden – Water Quality Improvement Project Grant – PA DEP Grant work must be completed by December 31, 2021. Project is substantially complete. Sign design sent to sign contractor/supplier for review and completion. Contractor notified to perform some maintenance of the basin prior to final acceptance.

Emergency Repairs – Station Road – Emergency storm sewer repairs are all substantially completed. Minor corrections per homeowners request completed.

Thornbury Pre-School Roof Replacement – Draft plans prepared for slate or synthetic slate alternate bidding. Submitted to Township officials for review and comment.

Forrest Hills Drive – Met with homeowners in November to review contractor proposals for private road rehabilitation. Sent standard Township specifications and details for informational purposes. Homeowner's are looking to move forward with engineering services for private road rehabilitation in Spring/Summer 2021.

Terra Firma Builders – 53-57 Sweetwater Road – Coordination with the Township and applicant on final closeout paperwork and bonding requirements ongoing.

Township Map Update – Working with Township officials to update the Township Map with new subdivisions and overall map corrections.

Salt Shed Structural Evaluation – Coordination ongoing with Township Roadmaster and structural engineer for the structural evaluation of the Township Salt Shed in Thornbury Park.

2021 Road Program – Virtual bid opening was performed on PennBid on May 6, 2021 with 4 bids received. Awarded to Glasgow Inc. for Base Bid and Alts 3 & 4 if needed. Preparing contracts for review and execution by the contractor and Township.

2021 Additional Paving Projects – Virtual bid opening was performed on PennBid on May 6, 2021 with 2 bids received. Awarded to Glasgow Inc. for Base Bid and Alts A. Preparing contracts for review and execution by the contractor and Township.

Various Drainage Improvement Projects – Prepared sketch plans and began discussion with Township officials on various drainage improvement projects throughout the Township.

ENGINEER'S REPORT
REGARDING WASTEWATER ISSUES
June 2, 2021

East Side District

– Wet Weather Flows to WWTP

- We continue to coordinate with Township staff and DELCORA to identify potential sources of Inflow and Infiltration (I/I).

The following items have been advanced since our last report:

- We have identified various manholes in the Tall Trees development that would benefit from the installation of infiltration dishes below the casting. We are working with Township staff to procure and install them.
- We are finalizing a summary of the I/I investigation work completed to date including a list of items to be addressed and areas that may be candidates for further investigation potentially via smoke testing.
- The daily pumping information generated by the new Omnisite monitoring system installed at the Creek Road West pump station has been downloaded and filed for documentation purposes. We are also looking at the data to determine if some significant flows recorded at the WWTP in early April correlate to increased flows at the pump station.

– Painting of Aeration Tank 1&2 @ WWTP

- A total of three (3) bids were received. The low bidder was J.P. Smith Contractors Inc. with a base bid of \$171,570.00. We will review the bids and documentation submitted and prepare a bid tabulation with a recommendation for the Board to consider at the June 2nd meeting.

– Black Bell Farm

- We have been in contact with the developer regarding the punch list. They have indicated the items identified are in the process of being addressed and will notify us when all work is complete.
