Jr. SUPERVISOR

Rebecca Kinzly reported, last week, Rustin had its spring production of Mary Poppins. The theater club worked very hard on the production and had 4 successful shows throughout the weekend. This was the last production of the year from Rustin. Also, the boys' basketball team won their game against Holy Ghost Prep with a score of 52-50. The team will play another game on Friday as they continue on in playoffs and their road to states. This week, our spring sport season began. On Monday, track, softball, baseball, and lacrosse teams began to practice and have tryouts to begin their seasons. The Board thanked Rebecca.

AGENDA ITEMS

Jeff Seagraves reported on the Petition to Intervene.

On a motion by James Kelly, seconded by Sheri Perkins, and carried unanimously, authorizing the Jim Byrne's office, to prepare a petition to intervene in the Public Utilities Commission proceeding, filed against Sunoco Pipeline, at docket number P-2018- 30017, and to file that on behalf of the Thornbury Township Board of Supervisors, was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment. There was no comment. Chairman Raith commented that we sent a letter on behalf of the residents in January. Jeff mentioned that will be a part of the exhibits.

Kenneth Kynett reported on the Taylor Mill Escrow Release Request.

On a motion by Sheri Perkins, seconded by James Kelly, and carried unanimously, Denying Escrow Release Request #1, from Toll PA IV L.P., for the Taylor Mill Subdivision located at Stony Bank Road, based on the Township Engineer's response email, dated 3/5/19 was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment, and then commented they will have to do a better job.

Jeff Seagraves reported on the 2019 Summer Camp Program.

On a motion by James Kelly, seconded by Sheri Perkins, and carried unanimously, authorizing 3 positions for the Thornbury Township Summer Camp, 1 Director and 2 Camp Counselors, for the 2019 Season, was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment. There was no comment.

Jeff Seagraves reported on the Lawlor Subdivision Extension.

On a motion by Sheri Perkins, seconded by James Kelly, and carried unanimously, the extension on the "Lawlor Subdivision", from March 14, to June 12, 2019, was approved. Chairman Raith called for comment. There was no comment.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Eric Friedman thanked the Board for their action on the petition to intervene and then reported on the pipeline accident this past Sunday. He then mentioned the association between the company on that project and ETP, and the location where it happened. He then went into detail about that accident and the damage it caused, and noted the similarities to other blasts. He spoke about other accidents and mentioned the history of incidents under these circumstances and how many times the company was cited for various conditions. Summing up his point, Mr. Friedman stated that his concern is a systemic problem with this company. He then mentioned the accident in Beaver County and the one in Darby Creek Delaware County. He spared the Board the details of those incidents, and then made the point that even though he appreciates the Board's petition to intervene, he would like to see the Township act on matters within its jurisdiction, specifically, the issuing of the Grading Permit, stating it is inadequate and expired, and also acting on any other permanent activities.

Jeff reported the WCASD Administrators have informed us that they selected two teachers from Rustin to receive the Freedom's Foundation Teaching Scholarship. The Township Public Works Department has reported each and every pothole on state roads to PennDot. Jeff recommended that residents also report them to PennDot.

We submitted comments to FERC on the Adelphia Gateway project on Friday, March 1, 2019. We received a letter from Edgmont Township regarding remediation of an abandoned oil tank at Wedgwood Gardens. We intend to offer comment given the close proximity of the remediation site to residences with wells in Thornbury Township.

REPORT OF THE ENGINEER March Supervisors Meeting March 6, 2019

Work completed for the period:

Grading and Road Encroachment Permits – Reviewed several plans for grading and road encroachment. Continuing construction inspections of various properties.

Planning Commission – Continued working with members on Ordinances and Subdivisions.

Subdivision & Land Development Plans:

Lawler Subdivision - Awaiting revised plans.

Daniels Subdivision – 425 Thornton Rd – 2 Lots – Conditional Final approval granted in 2016. Awaiting updated recording plans and agreements for signature.

26 Westtown Road - 2,160 SF Accessory Building Land Development review letter issued. Awaiting revised plans.

APG at Locksley Road - 183 Locksley Road - 16 Lot Residential Cluster Development Conditional Use Plan Received and under review for Planning Commission Meeting in March.

Ordinances:

Sign Ordinance – PC forwarded ordinance to the Supervisors for consideration.

Plant Materials List – Reviewed current Township Ordinance Plant Materials List and issued our Landscape Architect's recommendations for exclusions due to local blights and diseases. Reviewed with the Planning Commission in May. PC forwarded list changes to the Supervisors for consideration.

Crane Property – 24 Lot Subdivision – Roadway curb, stone, base course paving and binder paving has been installed. Work continues on stormwater facilities, retaining walls, site, and Lots 1 and 19 homes. General roadway grading work has now begun on the west side of Stoneybank Road. Utilities are being installed behind the roadway curbing.

Black Bell Farm (Walton Lane) – 15 lot subdivision – Lots 1-6, 8 and 11 homes are now occupied, with construction of other homes on Lot 7, 9, 10, & 12 ongoing.

Guilday Site – Lot 2 house construction is ongoing. The house construction on Lot 1 has begun.

Mill Creek – Reviewed roadway and storm sewer easement legal descriptions and sent to Solicitor for preparation of dedication documents.

Greenbriar V – Dallet Tract – Road Dedication accepted May 17, 2017, which started the Eighteen month maintenance period. Maintenance period expires November 17, 2018. Awaiting completion of maintenance bond punch list items. Met with developer on site and reviewed punch list items. Developer intends to complete maintenance bond items as soon as weather permits. Concrete repairs completed the week of February 4, 2019.

Barrett's Meadow – Project completed with minor repair items outstanding.

Sunoco Logistics – Notice sent to Sunoco to suspend work on sound wall due to field discrepancies from approved calculations. Additional information received and under review.

NPDES MS-4 Program – 2018 Pollutant Reduction Plan and 2018 MS-4 permit submitted on September 9, 2017 & September 15, 2017, respectively. Continuing to work with PA DEP on revisions.


Thornbury Park Parking Lot Expansion – Trainor Concrete & Paving completed final paving of the new and the original, parking lot including new striping on October 9, 2018. Minor corrections at the site are required to allow for final paperwork submission for closeout. Drainage improvements completed the week of January 7, 2019.

Cheyney University Demolition – Yarnell Building has been demolished. Site has been stabilized. Erosion controls removed. Projects appears to be completed, awaiting final inspection request.

Water Quality Improvement Project Grant – PA DEP Grant was awarded in the amount of \$75,864 for the proposed Thornbury Park basin retrofit into a rain garden site. Completed documents and exhibits were submitted to PA DEP for final preparation of the Grant Agreement. Anticipate 3-6 weeks until receipt of a final document for execution. Work must be completed by December 31, 2021.

Maintenance Building Evaluation – Architectural sketch plans prepared. Updated cost estimate and documents sent to Township for review.

Adelphia Gateway Pipeline – Reviewed pipeline upgrade documents and provided comment to the Township for consideration.





ENGINEER'S REPORT

REGARDING WASTEWATER ISSUES March 6, 2019

General

- Annual Television Inspection

• All television work was completed on February 15th. The more significant issues identified include a hole in the main on Grist Mill Road, a leaking manhole within the easement adjacent to Country Run and leaking manhole within the easement behind Strickland Way. We are in the process of reviewing the videos to determine if there are any additional issues. Upon completion, we will coordinate with Township staff to determine the most expeditious and cost-effective way to complete the repairs.

- Municipal Wasteload Management Reports

 The annual Chapter 94 reports for both the East and West Side Districts are anticipated to be complete and submitted to DEP and Concord Township next week

East Side Sewer District

- WWTP - Replacement of Existing Flow Control Box in E/Q Tank

The contractor has secured the major components for the project. Weather and peak flows will be
considered when scheduling this work. Likely the work will not commence for at least another
month. However, should circumstances warrant the box to be replaced sooner, the contractor can
mobilize relatively quickly.

- WWTP - Painting of Sludge Holding Tank

• This tank is scheduled to be painted this year. In advance of this painting, the tank will be cleaned and inspected to determine the extent of repairs necessary. This inspection work is anticipated to be completed within the next 2 to 3-weeks, weather permitting.

- Tapping Fee

• We met with Township staff on January 18th to review the tapping fee requirements and costs that could potentially be included in a revision. Some additional research is being conducted to determine the applicability of various costs associated with the 2004 expansion and confirm other Township expenditures related to capacity upgrades within the system.

- 183 Locksley Road

• Given the potential for additional connections, we are confirming for the Township the capacity within the Dylan Court pump station and the overall number of properties within the drainage area of the station.
